# Creighton University, Omaha, NE (July 2019-current)

**THR 131 Acting I** - Acting One explores stage presence, physicality, voice, and methods of character development. The purpose of the course is to introduce the student to the fundamental skills in the art of acting, develop the students' awareness of the actor's process, and to foster a general sense of theatre as an area of human endeavor.

**THR 330 Acting II** - Acting Two explores advanced demands of the student actor including physicality, voice, and methods of character development. The purpose of the course is to continue the student's theatrical education and expand the toolkit to develop the students' awareness of the analysis and approach to scripted performance and to foster an understanding of truthful acting in all genres.

**THR 335 Audition Technique** - Audition Technique explores the craft of auditioning and the practical application of skills that assist the actor investigate, select, and prepare appropriate audition material for the particular demands of the audition call. This course is part practice and coaching both finding and preparing materials and part simulated audition sessions through a variety of exercises, including cold reads, devised ensemble auditions, musical theatre and dance, cattle call unified auditions, and specific adverts for seasons, companies, or individual shows. Students will build a repertoire of audition selections and create acting resumes and portfolios.

**THR 217 Movement for the Actor** - This course builds on the tools and concepts introduced by going deeper into scene study, styles, and methodologies explored through the lens of physical work. Students are expected to engage in an intense exploration of demanding texts building a solid physical language grounded in truth and incorporating a variety of contemporary texts deemed appropriate for additional physical exploration. This should lead to confidence in preparing for rehearsal, consistent ability to create performances in a range of styles while maintaining their individuality. The course is designed to help achieve the widest range of physical and emotional expression through the body in relation to the space around us.

**THR 332 Voice for the Actor** - Advanced Voice for the Actor is designed as a companion course to Movement for the Actor and additional training beyond Acting I and II to increase and expand upon your skills as a vocal athlete. Utilizing various techniques from successful voice practitioners, the actor will gain control over diction, projection, breath support, control, nuance, and vocal health as well as a range of skills for dialect acquisition and performance.

**THR 341 Directing I** - Directing I guides the student to develop and explore basic script analysis, begin an exploration of the beginning principles of directing, explore and develop their artistic aesthetic in practical application of scene work, and develop and integrate ethical thinking as it pertains to the theatrical world and historical significance as well as personal choices and responsibilities in our art.

**THR 161 Theatre Appreciation** - This course functions as an introduction to the roles of the various artists of the modern theatre. Students explore a variety of artistic "hats" playing in turn the playwright, the director, the actor, and the designer. The focus is a hands-on approach to the experience of the dramatic arts.

**THR 432 Actor's Lab: Shakespeare -** Actor's Lab is designed to function as an upper-level theatrical course to provide our students additional special skills and specialized training in a particular subject area. THR 432 — Shakespeare and Contemporary Performance is a course designed around comprehending and performing Shakespeare's texts while making the work accessible to all audiences and performers through exploration of various methods, techniques, activities, and analyses.

**RSP 101 Ratio Studiorum Program** - (Latin for "plan of study") helps first- and second-year students plan their courses, careers and life. Through RSP, students receive comprehensive academic advising — during the first and into your second year, until majors are declared.

**MUS 363 Musical Theatre History I -** Through global exploration of the origins of musical theatre, this course is the first of two parts that make up the BFA/BA Musical Theatre curriculum. Delving into the roots of oral storytelling in African oral traditions and moving into Chinese opera, the students in this course learn about the traditions that shape our love for Musical Theatre, from the beginning up until the Golden Age of Musical Theatre. In addition to research and scholarship, each student is encouraged to build repertoire for their personal books to diversify their material selection for future auditions and concerts.

**MUS 265/365 Musical Theatre Performance Lab 1 & 2 -** Designed as a continuation of the Musical Theatre curriculum and auditions training, the students explore repertoire for their personal books from eras of Musical Theatre throughout history and work collaboratively in a laboratory setting to prepare, rehearse, and perform a diverse selection of material for future auditions and concerts.

**Medical Humanities SIS Theatre (Student Interest Selective)** - Medical students in their M1 or M2 year collaborate with undergraduate theatre students to investigate and diagnose characters in scripted plays as a means for developing better empathy, communication, and understanding for their human patients.

# Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge, LA (2 years, GA)

**THE 1020 Introduction to Theatre (undergraduate)** - Intro to Theatre explores the "whys" and "hows" of theatrical production, paying particular attention to the global nature of theatre and its status as an art form that flourishes in multiple cultures both past and present. Over the semester we will tackle a number of questions, including the following: Why do artists produce theatre, and why do spectators attend theatrical productions? How do the producers of theatre go about their work, what roles do artistic staff and the creative bodies play in theatrical production and how do we think about the relationship between artistic process and final product? Of particular interest is the way that theatre plays a crucial role in shaping and transforming identities and cultures.

**THE 1025 Introduction to Acting (multiple sections, undergraduate)** - The purpose of the course is to introduce the non-theatre major to the art of acting. Students will create and participate in various theatre games and exercises as well as basic monologue and scene work in an exploration of the actor's creative process. We will learn to appreciate the theatre both as actors and audience members.

**THE 2130 Script Analysis (co-instructor)** - Script analysis is a course designated to acquire a common analytic framework for analyzing scripts in depth for production, to improve your ability to generate, communicate, and justify your interpretations of plays, to expose you to a variety of plays and styles that might inspire future production choices.

**THE 2025 Acting Fundamentals: Meisner Technique (TA)** - Building upon the skills developed in 1025, students engage in the continued training for additional acting tools through the lens of behaving truthfully in imaginary circumstances applied in laboratory acting scene work.

**THE 4025 Advanced Acting: Scene Study/Period Styles (TA)** - This course is designed as an advanced scene study workshop to build on the tools and concepts introduced in THTR 3025 and 4025 by applying those tools to intensive exploration of a variety of demanding dramatic texts ranging from contemporary to classical as deemed appropriate. The goal is to develop and establish a flexible process of work which incorporates sound conceptual tools for the creation of THEATRICAL TRUTH in play analysis, rehearsal and performance of increasingly challenging texts. This process should lead to effective preparation, rehearsal technique and eventually to consistent ability to create performance in a significant range of materials without sacrificing the uniqueness of the individual artist. Scene work will begin with scenes drawn from Modern plays; proceeding to scene work that may extend beyond texts commonly associated with Realism.

**THE 2021 Directing I (TA, multiple sections)** - This course is designed as a beginning encounter with the role of the director in the theatre. This semester we will explore the director's function - what s/he is responsible for, what s/he does, and some of the ways in which s/he goes about fulfilling these functions. We will focus on issues of CRAFT; the basic tools of the director. That said, the director is a central and unifying component of the theatrical art. Your voice, your aesthetic, your management style, and how your singular "vision" manifests itself through these tools will also be an important component of our work.

# Virginia Commonwealth University, Richmond, VA (2.5 years, Adjunct Professor)

**BUSN 225/HONR 498** - Winning Presentations (multiple sections, undergraduate) - Why are some presenters bad, some good and others great? Why do some people have more "presence" than others? What leadership skills work in a room full of people who are not on the same page? How does one pitch an idea in less than two minutes? Presentation skills involve more than just speaking in public. Good presentation skills require an understanding of yourself, your subject and your audience. This course will explore the skills involved in mastering all of these.

**HONR 497/498 Social Political Drama (multiple sections, undergrad)** - Social Political Drama is a module course designed around conversations spurred from contemporary plays and social issues that inspire one another. Using source material as the jumping off point, we will discuss how life affects art and vice versa. This module focuses on how textual elements influence theatrical practices and conversations, and how theatrical events can be a way in for community change. Over the module we will tackle a number of questions, including the following: why theatre, why now?
