I value agency and transparency in my practice, which includes pay transparency and casting transparency. Boundaries and consent are an important and necessary part of our industry and it is never too early to begin bringing in good practices into process.

Representing the world as it is on stage is more interesting to me than homogenous storytelling - I want to see people of all ages, sizes, races, genders, languages and (dis)abilities in art. It's time we move beyond "white is right" and remember that everyone has a story to tell and theatre is a place where we can be on the front lines of change.
